Dan Golden, the keynote speaker, will address the conference on the topic: "Structure and Fragmentation in the Lives of Students." Dan says that he is struck by the strange combination of structure and fragmentation in student experience and how isolated classroom education is from the life and learning agendas of so many students.

Dan is the founding Director of the Filene Center for Work and Learning at Wheaton College. The Filene Center is Wheaton's life planning and experiential learning locus and oversees an institutional portfolio

based reflective learning process that yields up a "Second Transcript" for all students, the <u>Wheaton</u> <u>Work and Public Service Record.</u>

Dan Golden has been a consultant and program reviewer for schools and colleges on reflective learning design and serves as an assessor for the U.S. Department of Education on innovative education and service-learning projects. He holds a B.A. from Queen's College and an M.A, Ph.D. from Indiana University/Bloomington.
