

Overseas Association for College Admission Counseling Hosts its 21st annual Conference in Tampa Bay

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Overseas Association for College Admission Counseling (OACAC) hosted its 21th annual conference on July 8-11, 2014 in Tampa Bay, Florida, jointly hosted by University of South Florida, University of Tampa, and Eckerd College.

The conference provided an essential platform for the interaction of international admission and counseling professionals from around the world. The conference attendance was the highest ever, with nearly 1100 participants from over 80 different countries and 831 institutions. The OACAC conference is now the highest attended of all NACAC affiliates. Top leaders in the field – directors of admissions, secondary school counselors, practitioners, administrators, government, and NGOs – attended to strengthen best practices and leadership in the field of International Education.

Through over 80 educational sessions the conference pushed participants to challenge their own perceptions of international access to higher education and those of their colleagues. Topics covered included updates on UCAS, the Common Application, SAT and ACT tests; tips on applying to various university systems, working with students who need financial aid, recruitment strategies, and understanding numerous secondary educational ladders.

"The annual OACAC conference facilitates an exchange of ideas and strengthens relationships that will last for years, span the globe, and benefit thousands of students. This conference uniquely brings colleagues together on a global level to discuss the activities, ethics, and the strategies impacting access to higher education. As such, it has become the "go-to" annual conference within the field of international undergraduate admission," says OACAC President Ffiona Rees.

Networking and establishing relationships are key components of any OACAC conference. As an organization whose membership is spread out around the world, the annual conference is an important time where members can interact with each other in informal settings. These include conference staples like the annual DodgeBall competition, or the first annual 5k Run/Walk, which raised money for the OACAC scholarship fund, or other hospitality events.

Hosting the conference at a public institution also helped to create a positive and grounded feel to the annual gathering. Public access is fundamental to the core

of the OACAC mission, and it was fitting that this conference hosted the largest cohort of OACAC scholars to ever attend. Ten secondary school counselors were fully funded to attend the conference from around the world including Rwanda, Uganda, Indonesia, Nepal and Colombia.
