- iii. Updates to Policies & Procedures:
 - 1. OLD Policy: Only Institutional members can act as a referee for NEW Individual & Organization applicants
 - 2. NEW Policy: ALL members can act as a referee for NEW Individual & Organization applicants
 - 3. OLD Policy: A non-profit organization must demonstrate at least 3 years of operations.
 - 4. AMENDED: A non-profit organization should demonstrate at least 3 years of operations. At the discretion of the VP for Membership, a non-profit organisation may be recommended for membership with mentor support where evidence or length of operations is insufficient

and the purpose of the organisation is to support an underserved community.
