Idea to proposal Basics

- ➤ The proposal is 3-4 sentences!
- Envision the overall session
- Big idea What is the member benefit? Why this session? What need is met? What will someone learn/gain? What and who may it impact?
- > What format? Traditional panel, interactive, small group, activities
- > The title of the session attention grabbing & descriptive





Idea to proposal Expand your idea



- How your topic links to the theme, mission, purpose of the organization and event.
- Benefit what will the attendee gain and learn from the session?
- Ed Sessions Using the 60 minutes well what format and why?
- Takeaways? Possible follow-up?
- What voices? New perspectives, range of regions, viewpoints, institutions. Even a "core" topic can have new voices or a new approach.
- Think about members from all stages of their career. 101 or something meaty going beyond basic.
